

23 ARTIFICERS, LABOURERS, &c., employed at the INDIA OFFICE.

Labourers are engaged on the understanding that their employment can be terminated on a week's notice, and are considered in the early days of their employment as on trial. (Estabt. Papers, Vol. 25, page 1167.)

The grant to them of the increments in wages shown below is subject to their conduct being thoroughly satisfactory, and to their being perfectly competent for the duties which they have to perform. Those (not more than four in all) who carry coal receive 10s. a week each extra during the winter months while so employed; and the two who do the lighting up on Sundays receive 2s. a week each extra.
